
Insurance and Benefits

What is a Knight?

A Knight is a Catholic Gentleman 18 years of age or older who was initiated into the first degree where he learned the virtues of CHARITY. He may then advance to become a full 3rd degree Knight by initiation into the 2nd & 3rd degrees (major degree) where UNITY, FRATERNITY and DEFENSE of the PRIEST HOOD are emphasized. He attends monthly council meetings and becomes active by volunteering whatever time he can to the activities of the Knights of Columbus who work for the benefit of family, church and community

Some Knights may choose to join an assembly where they advance further and are initiated into the 4th or Patriotic degree. This degree is recognized by their formal dress, where a tux is worn on special occasions. Members of the 4th degree may purchase the required regalia and serve on the Honour Guard. This Corps of men bring that added touch to processions, funerals and other occasions.

The Knights offer an opportunity for fellowship with people who share the same beliefs, and who recognize the same duty to God, to family and to folks down the block or across the sea.
